Water Quality Testing in Elysian Valley

June 27, 2020

To: All Honorable council members of Elysian Valley Riverside Neighborhood Council Buried Under the Blue is applying for Neighborhood Purpose Grant (NPG) to conduct water quality testing in the Los Angeles flood control channel / Los Angeles River. In some of our past events in the region we were asked by residents of Elysian Valley and surrounding communities if the water quality in the Los Angeles River safe to be around. Buried Under the Blue organized with some local community grassroots organizations to have a discussion on water quality. We found that many residents were not aware of the potential hazards of the run off in to the river. Some resident complained about rashes and not feeling well after being exposed to the water.

Buried Under the Blue is a firm believer in community building and liberation through education for healthier communities especially communities of color where they have been neglected for decades on environment issues. We thought it would be a great opportunity to get a water quality testing project created and to partner up with Elysian Valley Riverside Neighborhood Council and local community groups to educate community members on what's in the Los Angeles River water. Buried Under the Blue is proposing the following project to be considered for the Neighborhood Purpose Grant below:

1. We would consider to contract a water quality consultant and water sample collector that would help on putting a protocol together for the water testing and collecting water samples for test. This may change if we can work with a local college or volunteers. We have added a few necessary tools to be able to conduct the testing, processing of data and website.

- Laptop
- Microsoft Office plus Program
- Zoom meeting account for 2 years
- Program insurance for 2 years

2. Once a protocol has been created we will then partner up with an EPA regulated laboratory where our water samples will be taken to be process. The laboratory will then test for 115 analytes like:

- 20 metals / minerals
- 7 inorganic compounds
- 4 Physical Factors
- 16 disinfectants and their byproducts
- 47 volatile organic compounds
- 20 pesticides, herbicides and PCBs

The estimated cost of each test is \$259.99 and the project will need between 16 – 20 tests. The shipping of this item is free but we will have to pay return shipping. The return shipping will need to be overnight or 1 to 2 days so the price will vary.

We will also be testing for Glyphosate (round up) this chemical was recently used through the Los Angeles River its very hazards to the health of our community member. This is a separate test estimated cost is \$129.99 and we will need between 8 and 10 tests. The shipping of this item is free but we will have to pay return shipping. The return shipping will need to be overnight or 1 to 2 days so the price will vary.

3. Once a test has been done there will be a full report of the laboratory findings and EPA National standards. We will then send the report to the Council and We will set up a website were the general public can obtain a copy of the findings. The website will be free to all for up to 2 years and may extend if funded. If any major water quality issues should be found in the report. We can work together to notify the proper agencies.

4. Once all the tests have been done there will be a final report on all test and it will be sent to the council.

Outreach

We will be building a website were all updates and test results will be posted in real time. We will add the Elysian Valley Riverside Neighborhood Council website link and if we print out any items the Elysian Valley Riverside Neighborhood Council logo will be added. There will be also a zoom account created for 2 years for communication and to keep with COVID-19 Guidelines when communicating with public or council. Due to high cost of the water quality testing. The budget did not allow us to add hours for public meetings but we will answer all questions or concerns through the website. We will try to search for other funding to help do public meetings through the website or zoom. We believe that this grant will be a great foundation for future projects.

Future

We hope to keep working with the council on projects that deal with education on building healthy communities and a safer environment. We are dedicated to searching for funding to continue this

water quality project in Elysian Valley as it really serves the whole city of Los Angeles. We will also be pushing for an air quality monitoring project for your region in the near future and hope that you can partner up with us on that project. 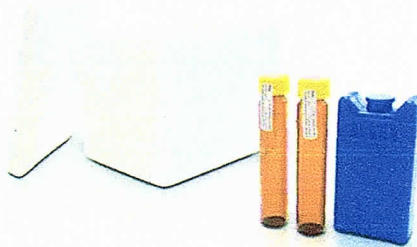

Purpose of Form

Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
 - Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
 - Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
 - Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
 - Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
 - Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
 - Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
 - Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)
