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City of Los Angeles Storm Response: During the two weeks leading up to this storm, the City worked to repair more than 4,000 potholes, reinforce hills that are at risk of mudslides and prevent power outages by making repairs to underground equipment and vaults that flooded during the previous storm. Mayoral Delegation Announces Los Angeles Region to Receive More Than \$300 Million in Reimbursements: Mayor Karen Bass, Council President Paul Krekorian and members of the Sacramento Delegation announced that the Los Angeles region would be receiving more than \$300 million in emergency reimbursements. The City of Los Angeles will receive nearly \$60 million in reimbursements for COVID-19 expenses from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Learn more here.


- Mayor Karen Bass announces resources ahead of February 1, 2024 rent deadline and RSO rent increase: Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass released information to assist renter households impacted by the February 1 deadline to repay owed rent between October 1, 2021, and January 31, 2023, as well as the rent increase of 4%, and up to 6% if the property owner pays utilities, for housing units under the Rent Stabilization Ordinance (RSO).
- Know your rights! Reach out for help. If you're facing an eviction, look for assistance right away. Information for landlords and mom and pop property owners can be found here.

- Determine Type of Notice When to Respond? If you received a pay or quit notice, you are typically not required to file an answer but you should reach out to the Los Angeles Housing Department. For the eviction process to be initiated after a 3-day notice, you will still need to receive an Unlawful Detainer (UD) notice.Click <u>here</u> for help to submit your UD response.

- HUD Awards over \$188 Million to Address Homelessness in Los Angeles: The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded over \$188 million for FY 2023 renewal and new projects to the Los Angeles Continuum of Care (LA CoC). This amount represents an increase of \$24.56 million over HUD's allocation to the LA CoC in FY 2022. This increase includes an adjustment for Fair Market Rent for existing programs and new programs.
